ANDREA HALL STACHNIEWICZ STATEMENT ON ROE V. WADE**

**QUEENS, NY-** Andrea Hall Stachniewicz, business owner, mental health policy advocate, community organizer, and candidate for Judicial Delegate in New York’s 36<sup>th</sup> Assembly District released the following statement in response to the imminent overturning of Roe V. Wade:

*“I am deeply disconcerted by the imminent overturning of Roe V. Wade. I am appalled by the apparent failing of the American judicial system that has allowed for the overruling of nearly fifty years of precedence. This supreme court opinion undoubtedly comes at a high cost to the moral fabric of our society, and the values we have collectively upheld for decades. Our need for judicial reform has become painfully apparent, now more than ever.*”

*“Women’s reproductive rights are human rights- a right to dignity, agency, and self-determination, over one’s own body. A threat to reproductive rights in the United States opens the door for human rights violations to become common place. This is a threshold that we absolutely must not cross.*”

*“As candidate for Judicial Delegate in Assembly District 36, I have every intention of upholding the values of Roe V. Wade when nominating the next supreme court judge for Queens County. As daughter of one of the first women to serve in the United States Air Force after the 1976 ending of WAF, upholding women’s rights has always been and will continue to be a top priority in my political advocacy work. I have every intention of representing the people of AD 36 in ensuring that Queens County remains a pillar in upholding women’s reproductive rights. I remain optimistic in our ability to move forward collectively, as a party and as a movement for the people.”*
